TESTIMONY

My name is Jackson Mesarieki. I was born at Oldonyosambu subdivision, Arusha region in northern Tanzania in the year 1979. My parents used to believe in traditional gods. They used to seek for ancestors consultation if they are in need of help. This led me to grow in the life of believing in their ways. I am the eighth child of the nine children in my parents' family. I joined primary school in 1987 and completed primary school in the year 1995, but I was not able to continue to secondary school because my father used to compel me to take care of his cattle. During all my childhood time, I used to believe on the gods and customs of my parents. I lived without the Savior. My parents were not able to satisfy me with the questions I used to ask them concerning their gods which only bring curses to the community. Evil spirits "*ilmeneng'a*" in Maasai language, used to come and demands for all the time to be fed with either fat sheep or goats. That business of slaughtering animals for all the time for evil spirits caused my parents to continue becoming poorer and poorer.

On 26th December 1999, I accepted the Lord Jesus as my Savior. The decision of accepting Jesus as my personal Savior came as a result of not being satisfied with the answers given by my parents concerning their beliefs in their gods. One day I heard a message from a guest preacher who came to contact an air meeting at our place. He preached on how dangerous life is without the Saviour. He used Rom. 3:23. When I realized that I was a sinner, I decided to give my life to Jesus.

I continued to attend the church for all of my life after my salvation. Through the teaching in Sunday school, I continued to grow spiritually and got prepared for church ministry together with other church members. I am married to Rachel on 24th March, 2000. Rachel is saved. We are blessed with two children Neema and Justin.

I accepted the call to ministry after I was elected as a worship service leader of my church, evangelist and later in the year 2001, I was encouraged to go and open a new preaching point where I am serving there at present. I love serving the Lord during my youth age.

I believe in one God who revealed Himself in three persons (Trinity). The Holy Bible which is the true word of God. I believe in the Church which is the body of Christ. On Saturdays and Thursday from 11.00 am to 4.00 pm I go to markets to preach because it market days in my area. On Sundays I use to go to the church for services. After services I have to stay with my family.

She wakes up in the morning and prepares children to go to school and prepare tea. Most of the time she do home activities like cooking and washing clothes. However, she joins me in farming after putting well home activities. In the afternoon she has to join me to visit Christian or in doing evangelism.

I do both. Most of the time drought become too tough in our area therefore we have to buy food.
