TESTIMONY

My name is pastor Marko Ndelilio Nassari. I was born in a pagan family in the 1956. My parents were typically pagans who were strictly faithful in our tribe customs and practices. It took me time before coming to give my life to the Lord Jesus because years back I used to follow the ways of my parents. There were several activities you must go through to reach a stage to be considered as a brave man in the community. One of those activities includes initiations whereby you have to know and practice the worship of our traditional ancestors. I stayed as a member of that society who attempted to follow those ways but my life was typically worse. The goal of traditional practices in my tribe is lead a member to become a witch doctor or a specialist who knows how to carry on traditional activities.

In the year 1990, God made a good plan for me to get saved. A team of preachers came to our village and called for a big meeting where they preached. Many people gave their lives to Jesus, including myself. The preacher preached on the love of God to all humankind which led Him to send His Son to come to dye on the cross to save us freely. He used John 3:16 and found myself receiving the gift of salvation.

In the year 1996, I received the call to serve the Lord. The Holy Spirit really convinced me to tell others about their evil ways and the need to accept the Lord Jesus. My church gave me a go on and prayed for me as a church evangelist. In the year 1999, my church called me as pastor a position which I am still serving in.

On my side I believe that the Bible is a revelation of God written by people through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. I believe that God is the cause and initiator of all seen and unseen things. I believe that the Holy Spirit is our helper who leads and gives strength to know and to accept the gift of salvation. On Saturday I rest and read the Bible.

On Sunday I go to the church

My wife's schedule is related with that of my wife but sometime she has to take some hours to prepare family food while we are at farming or other duties.

Yes we grow some food and purchase some.
